Course Overview:

The introduction to photography will establish the basic core rules of photography: compositional grids and lighting. Students will use these theories to analyse photographs from the old masters and contemporary Caribbean photographers in order to further their own photographic practice.

Learning Outcomes:

Students will be able to take technically correct photographs of landscapes and people in the streets as well as using the appropriate language to effectively communicate to others their photographs. They will be able to clearly write about their photographic practice using the theories of compositional grids and natural lighting.

Teaching Methodologies:

This course's lessons will be based around established contemporary and historical artist and using them as an example to discover new and unique photographic styles. It may contain, but is not limited to:

- Instructor led lectures in which theories will be discussed in detail.
- Student led critiques in which assignments are discussed.
- One on one studio days.
- Real world demonstrations where we go out into Georgetown and its surrounding areas.
- · Films and screenings.
- · Guest lectures.
- Optional Photo-walks in conjunction with the Guyana Photographers group.

Evaluation Methods:

Students will be evaluated on the following:

- Oral and visual presentation of all assignment (40%)
- Midterm Exam (10%)
- Printed Portfolio of 10 photographs (10%)
- Attendance and Participation (15%)
- Personal Development Plan Essay (25%)

Students will be graded based on the following:

- Participation in class discussion
- The ability to understand concepts and put them into practice
- The ability to communicate their works both verbally and written
